Sec. 2.75 Records: Dealers and exhibitors.

(a)(1) Each dealer, other than operators of auction sales and brokers to whom animals are consigned, and each exhibitor shall make, keep, and maintain records or forms which fully and correctly disclose the following information concerning each dog or cat purchased or otherwise acquired, owned, held, or otherwise in his or her possession or under his or her control, or which is transported, euthanized, sold, or otherwise disposed of by that dealer or exhibitor.

\* Licensee needs to maintain a complete listing of all dogs on the premise. The current dog on hand sheets show 22 dogs shy of having a complete lists. Licensee needs to add the 22 dogs to the current dog on hand sheets. Correct by 3/12/09.

### 3.1 (a)

#### HOUSING FACILITIES, GENERAL.

(a) Structure; construction. Housing facilities for dogs and cats must be designed and constructed so that they are structurally sound. They must be kept in good repair, and they must protect the animals from injury, contain the animals securely, and restrict other animals from entering.

¿ Single decker building east side outside attached runs, 4th floor from the north is broken & has broken protruding vinyl coated flooring that the dogs have to walk on. Licensee needs to repair the broken flooring before injury occurs to 2 dogs. Correct by 3/12/09.

¿ Single decker building west side 3rd divider from the north has broken & protruding wires at the bottom of the divider. Licensee needs to keep all wire dividers in good repair at all times so injury will not occur to 4 dogs. Correct by 3/12/09.





### 3.1

#### HOUSING FACILITIES, GENERAL.

(a) Structure; construction. Housing facilities for dogs and cats must be designed and constructed so that they are structurally sound. They must be kept in good repair, and they must protect the animals from injury, contain the animals securely, and restrict other animals from entering.

\* West single decker building east side primary enclosure flooring is starting to sag & come loose from the PVC frame. The flooring needs to be retied so that the floor will no longer sag & the flooring will be kept in good repair affecting 11 dogs. Correct by 2/3/08.

\* West double decker building east outside attached runs to this building top row, 3rd divider from the south, the divider wire has protruding & missing wire on this divider that needs to be repaired or replaced before injury occurs to 4 dogs & the divider needs to be kept in good repair. Correct by 2/3/08.

\* East double decker building east side bottom row, first enclosure from the south, the expanded metal flooring has a rusted hole in the floor. The rusted hole in the floor needs to be repaired so that the flooring will be kept in good repair & protect 2 dogs from possible injury. Correct by 2/3/08.

### 3.4

#### OUTDOOR HOUSING FACILITIES.

(b) Shelter from the elements. Outdoor facilities for dogs or cats must include one or more shelter structures that are accessible to each animal in each outdoor facility, and that are large enough to allow each animal in the shelter structure to sit, stand, and lie in a normal manner, and to turn about freely. In addition to the shelter structures, one or more separate outside areas of shade must be provided, large enough to contain all the animals at one time and protect them from the direct rays of the sun. Shelters in outdoor facilities for dogs or cats must contain a roof, four sides, and a floor, and must:

(3) Be provided with a wind break and rain break at the entrance.

### 2.40 (a)

#### ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

(1) Each dealer and exhibitor shall employ an attending veterinarian under formal arrangements. In the case of a part-time attending veterinarian or consultant arrangements, the formal arrangements shall include a written program of veterinary care and regularly scheduled visits to the premises of the dealer or exhibitor.

\* Program of vet care calls for an annual inspection by the vet of record. Last recorded on site was on 2/10/05 affecting 209 dogs. Correct by 6/25/07.

### 2.40 (b)

#### ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

(3) Daily observation of all animals to assess their health and well-being.

\* Shihtzue dog # 032 631 297 is showing dried, caked blood on its neck. Licensee has stated the injury was due to a dog fight. Licensee had not addressed the injury to this dog. Dog was seperated during the inspection to be treated later by the licensee. Adequate vet care is essential for the health & well being of the dog. Correct by 5/26/07.

### 3.11

#### CLEANING, SANITIZATION, HOUSEKEEPING, AND PEST CONTROL.

(b) Sanitization of primary enclosures and food and water receptacles.

(2) Used primary enclosures and food and water receptacles for dogs and cats must be sanitized at least once every 2 weeks using one of the methods prescribed in paragraph (b)(3) of this section, and more often if necessary to prevent an accumulation of dirt, debris, food waste, excreta, and other disease hazards.

\* Licensee is currently housing 3 cages of dogs on the carpet in her house. Carpet can not be adequately cleaned & sanitized in accordance with USDA regulations. Licensee needs to replace the carpeting with solid floor surfaces that can be adequately cleaned & sanitized affecting 5 dogs. Correct by 6/25/07.
